

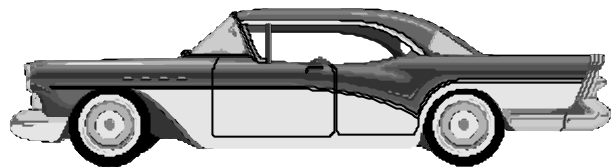

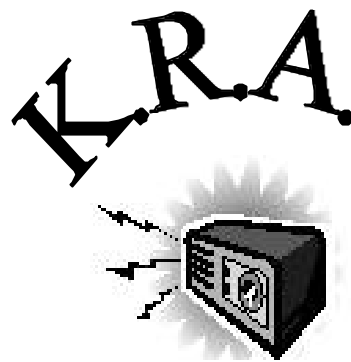

Fortunately the residents were not in the home at the time of the fire being on their annual outing to the Silver Spurs Casino in Rainbow Valley.
